# FARMERS DEVELOPMENT ORGANIZATION (FDO) (Constituted under section 42 of Companies Ordinance, 1984) NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2017

### 1- GENERAL INFORMATION

- 1.1- Farmers Development Organisation was incorporated on January 24, 2014 as a non-profit organization under section 42 of companies ordinance 1984. It is engaged in the working for the economic and social development of poor communities through providing services in education, basic health and community physical infrastructure.
- 1.2- The financial statements are presented in Pak Rupee, which is the organisation's functional and presentation currency.

#### 2- STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards as applicable for Non Government/Profit organizations in Pakistan. Such approved accounting standards comprise of set of International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS) issued by International Accounting Standard Board (IASB) and ammended by Institute of Chartered Accountants Pakistan (ICAP) through guidelines issued in October 2009, to suit the operations and transactions of Non Government/Profit Organizations.

### 3- SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### 3.1- Accounting convention

These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention modified by financial instruments at fair value.

### 3.2- Grants / Donations

Grants/donations are recognized when it can be reasonably ensured that organization shall certainty comply with all conditions attaching to such grants/donations. Donors grants relating to operating fixed assets are treated as deferred income and released to income and expenditure account over the expected useful lives of the assets concerned.

### 3.3- Revenue recognition

- Funds provided by donors to subsidize operating and administrative expenses are recognized as grant income as per term of agreement with donors.
- Funds utilized for acquiring fixed assets are taken to deferred grant and amortized over the useful life of the assets.
- Grants related to capacity building are taken to deferred grant and amortized as actual expenses incurred on account of capacity building.

### 3.4- Restricted funds

The restricted fund comprises the accumulated surplus and deficit of donations and grants for which the donor has specified an intention to support a particular aspect of activities together with income accruing directly to those restricted funds. Surpluses are held until they are fully expended or returned at the end of the respective grant period.

### 3.5- Unrestricted funds

The unrestricted fund comprises the accumulated surplus and deficit of united funds/ donation and grants which are used by organization for its various project activities, according to its other programs and plans.

### 3.6- Operating fixed assets

#### Owned

- Operating fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any. Depreciation is charged to income applying reducing balance method to write-off the cost over the estimated remaining useful life of assets. The useful life and depreciation method are reviewed periodically to ensure that the method and period of depreciation are consistent with the expected pattern of economic benefits from items of operating fixed assets. Rates of depreciation are stated in respective note. In respect of additions and disposals during the year, depreciation is charged from the month of acquisition and upto the month preceding the disposal respectively.
- Gain/loss on disposal of operating fixed assets is taken to income and expenditure
  account. Normal repairs and maintenance are taken toincome and expenditure
  account as and when incurred. Major improvements and modifications are
  capitalized and the assets replaced, if any, other than those kept as stand-by, are
  retired.

- All capital expenditure shall be capitalized provided that the useful life of the assets is more than one year. However, assets whose useful life is estimated to be more than a year but the price does not exceed Rs. 2,000/- would be charged to revenue expense. Major renewals and improvements are capitalized where normal repair and maintenance costs are charged to income as and when incurred. Gain or loss, if any, on disposal of assets is included current year's income.
- The management assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset is impaired. If any such indication exists, the management estimates the recoverable amount of the assets. If the recoverable amount of the asset is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount of the asset is reduced to its recoverable amount by charging the impairment loss against income for the period / year.

#### Donated assets

Donated assets are stated at fair value of the asset at the time of acquisition.

### 3.7- Cash and cash equivalents

For the purpose of cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents consisted cash in hand, balances with banks.

### 3.8- Allocation of common cost

Common cost are cost used by more than one activity and cannot be allocated to single project activity. Common costs are allocated to the activities on a basis consistent, to the extent possible, with the actual use of the resources by the activities from relevant project/ programs budgets.
